

Marblehead Yacht Club Clemson Chase Race

The sixth edition of the Clemson Chase Race will be Sunday June 30 at noon. The starting area is right outside the mouth of the harbor at Marblehead Channel Entrance Bell. This year we are encouraging more of our own Club boats to register and race. No matter what kind of sailboat you own, or what condition your sails are in, you should come out and try this pursuit race. The start is easy since you are given your own individual starting time, and with the pursuit format the object is to get to the finish line ahead of everyone else. Last year we had 32 boats register, start the race and finish. Afterwards there will be a party held in the Lavendar Room with refreshments and race awards. So put the race on your calendar and plan to join in on the fun!

Downeast Challenge

We will be running the Downeast Challenge race on August 2–3 this year. This is a 100 mile long distance overnight race from Marblehead to Boothbay Harbor Maine. We are co-hosting the race with the Boothbay Harbor Yacht Club who will manage the finish and awards party. Sailboats with a PHRF certificate that are 26 feet or longer are encouraged to join. This is a great way to sail up to the Maine coast in the company of other sailors. We will be holding the skipper's meeting with sponsor Rumson's Rum tasting on Thursday night Aug 1 and starting the race Friday Aug 2 at 10am.
