Waterfront Update

The Waterfront Committee, along with Dock Master Bill Kilham, has been busy preparing for the 2022 boating season. The docks and floats are currently going through maintenance and repairs. Bill is readying the launches, completing annual maintenance, preparing for our scheduled Coast Guard inspections, and finally our 2022 launch schedule is set. All will be ready when the season begins.

As a volunteer group we welcome any member to join the Waterfront Committee.

Manager's Minit

We hear so much about “infrastructure” these days, but some of the most important infrastructure here at the MYC is often taken completely for granted. The floats you say? Correct!

–We have over 500’ of ½’ long link chain that needs constant replacement on an annual rotating basis. That’s akin to 2–3 boat moorings every 3 seasons.

–5 multi-ton mooring blocks and 3 drilled ledge anchors keeping us generally in the right place.

–4 ¾” steel float irons with 2 2” solid float pins connecting our two 32’x16’ mains with a pair of smaller irons and pins for our 24’x10’ gangway float.

–4 30’ lengths of 5/8 inch, 3 strand nylon lines at the gangway base (replaced annually) keep our constantly moving floats attached to a hopefully immovable pierhead. Even on the calmest days there’s a 1–3

knot tidal current almost always tugging one way or the other.

– More floatation tubs than I care to count keep our feet out of the water no matter how many pounds of ice gets packed in the cooler (not to mention traffic on July Fourth).

–Last fall's late season 3 day northeast storm has required replacement of two 1'x1'x 15' spruce header logs; delivered by rail from the forests of the Pacific Northwest (Ooooo! Such a grand image!). Everything about the floats must be robust, oversized and able to withstand 6 months of ocean living.

–The annual cost of maintenance, haul/launch, permits and storage of our three floats is routinely the fourth largest expense within our yearly budget, yet could we have a yacht club without them; I think not.

Most MYC members are lucky enough to not feel the need to dwell on such matters and can simply stroll comfortably across our floats as they enjoy time spent at their Club, as it should be. Perhaps we can all take a quick moment this season to fully appreciate what's under our feet and what goes into making our time on the water so convenient. After all, isn't the best infrastructure something we rely on and take for granted on a regular basis?

Capt. Michael Rutstein is the owner and operator of the Schooner FAME of Salem — no stranger to the sailors of Marblehead, who have been crossing

tacks with her on Salem Sound since 2003. FAME is a full-scale replica of one of the first American privateers to put to sea during the War of 1812, and the first to send in prizes: a ship and a brig, headed to England with shipbuilding timber, captured off New Brunswick on July 4, 1812.

Capt. Rutstein is an enthusiastic historical researcher and has written two books about the War of 1812. His talk will focus on the exciting story of the original FAME, the building of the modern representation at the Burnham Boatyard in Essex, MA, and the challenges of operating a traditional wooden schooner in the modern era.
