MYC Launch Operator Licensing Class

MYC and Boatwise, a USCG approved marine training organization, will again offer a launch operators licensing course at Marblehead Yacht Club on the weekend of

January 12 and 13, 2019. Successful completion of the course meets the requirement for the US Coast Guard examination. Details of the course are available at the [Boatwise website](#). If you are interested and can't attend on the January date, Boatwise offers the same program at other locations and dates on the Northshore and it will be offered again at MYC the weekend of April 27 and 28, 2019.

If you or someone you know is looking for launch license training this is a great opportunity. MYC is always eager to hire both full and part time drivers and offers a reimbursement program for the course and licensing fees paid out over three years for those who make a commitment to work at MYC. The Club is especially interested in recruiting drivers who can fill in before the regular season starts and in the fall. Engine Repair at Marblehead High School

John Payne, Marine Mechanics Instructor, at Marblehead High School has a been key part of MYC's successful Winter Program series for 3 years and offers the services of the Marine Tech program to MYC members.

Do you have a small marine engine that may need general maintenance, i.e. oil change, tune-up or minor repair issues? Then maybe **Marine Tech** can help! This year the Marine Tech program at Marblehead High School has expanded, and we now offer two Marine Tech II classes to our students. Because of this expansion, we can now offer our services beginning this fall, into the winter and early spring.

We are looking for boats or engines that may require minor repairs and/or general maintenance for our Marine Tech students to work on. PLEASE NOTE you will be required to pay for all parts for the repairs, and a minimal equipment usage fee will be charged. Any usage fees will go back into the Marine Tech program and help defray costs for class materials, i.e. tools, etc.
