Work is ongoing inside the clubhouse with some slight modifications within the Galley space as well as trim and paint around the new sliding doors on the second floor.

Launch #1 has had its deck work completed and is in the process of being painted as I write this. The rebuild of the engine from #2 is well underway and right on schedule. The plan is to have it back in place before the USCG Dry Dock Inspections of all three boats this April.

The Gangway re-decking project moves ahead slowly (see "pick-a-nice-day" above) with young Mr. Sullivan doing yeoman service for the club. The new decking is primed and ready for non-skid paint and installation whenever Mother Nature decides to cut us some slack. Mr. Mace has renewed sections of our hoist system and is more than ready to help get us back in business come springtime.

I'm happy to report that along with most of our returning Launch Drivers we will have Sarra Newhall-Tubbs back with us this 2014 season. In addition, I'm looking forward to training two brand new Drivers who specifically sought out the MYC as their employer of choice. They should round out the Waterfront Staff nicely.

As the weather warms (perhaps I should say, *if* the weather warms), I will be spending more time at the club.
