MYC 2018 Annual Meeting Highlights

Here are the major takeaways from the MYC Annual Meeting **Saturday November 10th.** The complete minutes of the meeting are available_on line <u>here</u>.

The budgets were approved as presented. The operating budget includes a dues increase of \$70 for Active (Boating) Members and \$35 for Associate (Social) Members. The 2019 dues for Active Members will be \$740 and for Associate Members \$370. The budget provides for the hiring of a cleaning service to maintain the Club house and also for hiring an Assistant Dockmaster.

The Capital Budget was also approved as presented and includes funding for the long awaited shower. More detail on the proposed shower is provided below.


MYC Offers Launch Operator Licensing Class

MYC and Boatwise, a USCG approved marine training organization, will again offer a launch operators licensing course at Marblehead Yacht Club on the weekend of January 12 and 13, 2019. Successful completion of the course meets the requirement for the US Coast Guard examination. Details of the course are available at the <u>Boatwise website</u>. If you are interested and can't attend on the January date, Boatwise offers the same program at other locations and dates on the Northshore and it will be offered again at MYC the weekend of April 27 and 28, 2019.

If you or someone you know is looking for launch license training, this is a great opportunity. MYC is always eager to hire both full and part time drivers and offers a reimbursement program for the course and licensing fees paid out over three years for those who make a commitment to work at MYC. The Club is especially interested in recruiting drivers who can fill in before the regular season starts and in the fall. A Shower at MYC

As noted in the Annual Meeting recap, the shower committee successfully prepared a plan and proposal to add a shower facility at MYC by repurposing one of the toilets on the second floor in the Lavendar Room. The estimated cost of \$17,500 was approved at the Annual Meeting and will be funded from Club savings. The next step is the selection of a contractor as soon as possible with the goal of having the shower available by the beginning of the 2019 season.
