Greetings,

With opening day this weekend, the 2015 season is finally here. The preparations for the season are detailed throughout the newsletter and are the result of many volunteers pitching in to make MYC work smoothly. Thanks to all who have helped out. As with our own homes, there is always stuff to do around the "house." If you would like to contribute some time to help the Club look better or keep the Club running, just speak to Bill Killham or any of the board members.

In the last issue of Under the Rock, I highlighted the formation of the Capital Planning Committee to develop a five to ten year view to maintain the momentum of improvements to the Club and plan what members want. To date the committee has prepared a comprehensive "wish" list of items that we would all like to see at the Club. Some of these are must haves: completing the plan to refurbish the launches, for example. If the launches don't run we can't function. Other items are less critical but still important to how we function as a Club. Adding a shower to our facility is a good example. Is it critical to our function? Arguably not, but to many members it is an important amenity that would improve their enjoyment of the Club. The capital planning process will balance the must haves and the desirables within the resources of the Club. Resources is a nice word for money. Over the past two years we have been able to budget around \$30,000 annually for capital improvements to the launches. Assuming the Club can continue with that budget and there aren't any unforeseen expenses, the capital plan will begin to address some of the items on the desirable list. The committee's goal is to provide a timeline and plan for the budget process this fall.

Looking forward to seeing you on opening day.
