# **Galley and Dining Update**

The Galley opens for the season this Friday June 3. The schedule for the weekend is:

Friday June 3
Dinner from 4:00pm to 8:00pm

Saturday June 4 and Sunday June 5
Breakfast from 8:00pm to 11am
Lunch from 11:00am to 4:00pm
Dinner from 4:00pm to 8:00pm

The beginning of the 2022 season at MYC is particularly exciting as we welcome our new catering service, K/C2 (KC Squared). KC (aka Kevin) and Casey have been working off season to make sure the transition is as seamless as possible with the goal of improving the dining experience at MYC. Some things will be obvious like a new menu and new dishes. Less obvious but more important is their investment in a Point of Sale System to automate processing orders which will improve service.

The House Committee has been working closely with K/C2 to ensure their success and maximize the use of our limited dining facility. In line with that, the House Committee has approved two changes to the House Rules while the galley is open. Bringing your own prepared food, snacks and appetizers is no longer permitted during galley hours. In lieu of that K/C2 will provide complimentary snacks; i.e. pretzels, goldfish, crackers or an occasional house made appetizer. Additionally, the menu will include a selection of appetizers or hors d'oeuvres. The second change is that a table occupancy limit of ninety minutes may be enforced during busy times. These small changes will allow more people to enjoy dining on the deck on those beautiful summer evenings we are all looking forward to.

#### **Waterfront Update**

Under the capable direction of the dockmaster, Bill Kilham, the Waterfront is up and running. All three MYC launches are in the water, and the waterfront staff is ready to drive our members safely from the MYC dock to their vessels. Beginning Monday June 6, the waterfront will be running Summer Hours, 8 AM to 10 PM seven days week, through Labor Day. Remember launch service "Last Call" is 15 minutes prior to closing. #### **History Committee Update**

#### **Lavender Room Plaque**

Many members may know that the upstairs lounge is called the Lavender Room, but most do not know why. It was named for William Lavender who was elected Commodore of the MYC for six years between 1938–1944. Before joining the MYC he was the Commodore of the Beachcomber Dory Club (located near Fort Sewell) and reputed to be a dory sailing 'Ace'. When the Beachcomber Dory Club failed, he and others joined the Marblehead Yacht Club and bought Townies (another sailing dory), helping establish the Townie as the longest running one–design sailboat in Marblehead (since 1935). When Lavender died in 1945, the members named the upstairs lounge the Lavender Room in his honor.



At this year's Opening Day Cookout, the History Committee hung a plaque in the Lavender Room with a blueprint of a sailing dory similar to the type Lavender raced. The dory blueprint was graciously donated by a John Lightbody who came across it in an estate sale, and reached out to the MYC since the blueprint mentioned the dory was designed in Marblehead. The

plaque reads: 'William Lavender Room. Commodore 1938–1944. Dory Sailing Champion'. Next time you are upstairs, take a look at the plaque and ask your guest "would you like to know why we call this room the Lavender Room?".

# **MYC History Book**
