Various MYC Board Members and Flag Officers attend the meetings on a regular basis, as does our Bookkeeper, Frank Hart. These reports are generated on a monthly basis. The main objective is to make sure the revenue and expenses are tracking to plan. Any anomalies are discussed and researched, if need be. The Finance Committee reports their activities to the Board on a monthly basis. The Committee works with the Board to formulate the Operating Budget for the next upcoming boating year.
