Waterfront and Regatta Update

This year we were blessed with great weather and a well maintained fleet of launches driven by a crew of great launch operators. Special thanks to the waterfront staff for managing the July 4th services and for assisting with the post-squall chaos in early August when a micro-burst went through the harbor and blew some of our deck furniture into the water and capsized several Townies.

MYC also hosted two successful regattas, both sponsored by Rumson's Rum and Rising Tide brewing (be sure to support our sponsors on your next trip to the liquor store!).

The **Clemson Chase Race** was held on Sunday June 30 and had 19 registered boats. The Clemson Chase Race is a staple regatta in the MassBay Sailing Association's Pursuit Race series and drew boats from the Marblehead, Gloucester and Boston areas. To add to the excitement, after the race there was a surprise hail storm pelting the MYC deck with raisin-sized hail during the awards party.

The **Downeast Challenge** held August 2–3 was a 100 mile race to Boothbay, Maine with a record number of 22 registered boats including the largest fleet of Short–Handed racers in northern New England with 11 boats. MYC's own Fred Schmid not only won the Racing class in Whistler, but his crew Matt Gershun won the new 'Broken Spreader Award' for being hoisted up a halyard in a make-shift bosuns chair to unwrap a twisted spinnaker mid-race. The Downeast Challenge perpetual trophy 'Broken Spreader Award' was presented to us by Paul Leddy of the Portland, Maine fleet, after he broke his spreader before last year's race and had it fixed in time to participate. Special thanks to members who lent use of moorings or rafting for out of town boats, and the waterfront staff for assisting them, and the MYC Race committee for running the 2 successful regattas.

MYC Offers Launch Operator Licensing Class

MYC and Boatwise, a USCG approved marine training organization, will again offer a launch operator licensing course at Marblehead Yacht Club on the weekend of January 11 and 12, 2020. Successful completion of the course meets the requirement for the US Coast Guard examination. Details of the course are available at the <u>Boatwise website</u>. If you are interested and can't attend on the January date, Boatwise offers the same program at other locations and dates on the Northshore.

If you or someone you know is looking for launch license training, this is a great opportunity. MYC is always eager to hire both full and part time drivers and offers a reimbursement program for the course and licensing fees paid out over three years for those who make a commitment to work at MYC.
