Due diligence from the MYC Finance Committee "Budgeteers" has kept these and other costs well within reason and spread over a number of years.

## **MYC Sail Training**

In an exciting new initiative Marblehead Yacht Club will sponsor an adult sailing program on weekends during May. The response from the member survey a few weeks back was positive and we hope to fill the classes with existing and prospective members. The program will assume no prior knowledge of sailing and appeal to beginner and intermediate sailors. It is an excellent brush up for crew members, those who have been away from sailing for a while, or for self taught sailors with gaps in their sailing knowledge. The orientation is toward day sailing and near shore cruising and is not a racing course.

The course will consist of two 2-hour classroom sessions at Marblehead Yacht Club, and four 4-hour on-the-water sessions sailing from MYC floats. The classroom sessions are on two consecutive Friday evenings. The first course will start Friday May 8th with the on the water sessions on May 9, 10, 16 and 17. The second course will start on Friday May 22nd with the on the water sessions following on May 23, 24, 30 and 31.

Fees for the course are \$255 for MYC Members and \$295 for non-members.

He worked for GE and other engineering companies developing medical devices as well as marine equipment. As an active member of Marblehead Yacht Club he did much of the rehab on the clubhouse as well as floats and gangway construction. He loved to sail his boat "Magic Draggon" and both of his sons David Jr. and Gregory were launch drivers for several seasons. Some may remember his daughter Mehra driving her bike from North Reading to MYC to clean the club and help her dad work on the club.

**Jeff Howlett,** a long time launch driver at Marblehead Yacht Club, died on March 1st. Jeff and his wife Joan made their home in Marblehead after his service in the US Navy. He was very proud of his experience in the Submarine Service and was cofounder of the Submarine Veterans Marblehead Base.
