Our new officers Commodore Marion McCauley, Vice Commodore Alan Petersen, Rear Commodore Paul Mervis, Secretary Ellen McGrail, Treasurer Glen Kewly and new Board Members Carol Kent and Tip O'Neil, along with the remaining Board members, are already hard at work planning for the 2016 season and keeping the Club's traditions alive.

#### 2015 MYC Annual Meeting

**The Annual Meeting** was well attended and the following highlights will be of general interest to all the members.

Budget: The proposed operating and capital budgets were approved as presented. The combined budgets do not require an increase in membership dues for 2016. The Capital Budget includes funding to complete the refurbishing of the engines, with Launch 3 scheduled for an engine rebuild this winter.

The proposed change to the Marblehead Yacht Club Constitution to change the percentage of Associate Members from 20% to 30% was approved.

The slate of officers proposed by the Nominating Committee was approved. New members of the Board of Directors are Carol Kent and Tip O'Neil, each elected to a one-year term. Outgoing Commodore Tom Despres was elected to a three-year term. The Flag Officers for the 2016 season are Marion McCauley, Commodore; Alan Petersen, Vice Commodore; and Paul Mervis, Rear Commodore. Ellen McGrail and Glen Kewley were elected Secretary and Treasurer respectively. Outgoing Treasurer Chris Booth was recognized for his contribution in bringing a level of professionalism to the Club finances. Outgoing Secretary Doug Burgess was recognized and thanked for his 11 years of continuous service on the board and many contributions to MYC.

The Club Manager's report and Committee reports provided a summary of the season and outlined plans for the 2016 season. Notably:

**Club Manager Bill Kilham** detailed plans for the refurbishing of Launch 3.

**Communication Committee Chair Tom Despres** acknowledged the work of the Committee, notably Webmaster Stu Newman. The Club newsletter was published 4 times and 34 emails were distributed to communicate Club events and notices.

**Entertainment Committee Chair Tom Despres** cited the great efforts of the Entertainment Committee in making the Club much more than water access and lead a round of applause for the group.

**Board Member Bill Betters** reported for both the Finance Committee and the Capital Planning Committee. The proposed 2016 Operating Budget is similar to the 2015 budget with conservative assumptions of income, \$266,000 and expenses \$237,000, and anticipated net earnings of \$29,000.

The Capital Planning Committee developed a comprehensive list of needs, ranked them and provided a short list of recommended Capital Planning Needs for 2016. The Board of Directors approved a final Capital Budget including the engine work on Launch 3 and smaller improvements to the clubhouse.

**The Fleet Committee** report was provided by Tom Despres. The Club held a successful cruise to Eastern Point Yacht Club in Gloucester with a second night in Rockport. Plans are underway for a more extended cruise next summer to Portsmouth NH.

**House Committee Chair Alan Petersen** detailed the improvements to the clubhouse during the year: notably structural repairs to the Galley including new flooring and fresh paint, a new back door and a new AED Defibrillator. Alan also announced that building on a much improved season, Diamond Catering would be returning as Galley caterer next season. It was noted that the Board of Directors have approved a \$15 increase in the Galley Food Card from \$45 to \$60. Alan highlighted a change in Club policy as members may transfer an unused portion of their annual food card to another member.

Alan cited the spirit of volunteerism that makes Marblehead Yacht Club the unique organization that it is and thanked the many past volunteers and encouraged others to sign up and join in.

**Membership Committee Chair Marion McCauley** provided a summary of the membership figures and a rationale for the increase in Associate Members. The final 2015 membership numbers showed an overall increase of 10 members totaling 335. Active Members, formerly called Boating Members, had a net decline of 16 for a total of 270. Associate Members, formerly called Social Members, had a net increase of 27 for a total of 65. The 65 Associate Members are essentially at the allowed 20 percent cap putting the Club in the position of potentially turning away revenue from Associate Members while revenue from Full Members is declining.

**Race Committee Chair Tom Anderson** reported that the Clemson Chase Race on Sunday July 19th was a success with 17 boats registered and 15 participating. An after race party was held in the Lavendar Room with the first presentation of the Clemson Trophy. The winner was Hoff Stauffer in Amazing Grace, an Alerion 38 from Gloucester.

The date for next year's Clemson Chase Race is July 17<sup>th</sup> and plans are underway to encourage more MYC boats to enter.

**Waterfront Committee Chair Marion McCauley** summarized the accomplishments for the year:

- This winter we will see the completion of the 3 year plan to refurbish the launches;
- A new safety ladder was installed on the main float;
- MYC increased our visibility as a sailing club by welcoming the Town Class Fleet and working on ways to access the boats on trawl lines near Back Beach;
- Discussions regarding the pier erosion resulted in agreement by the Harbormaster to budget this major repair in 2017;
- The creative thinking of Bert Williams was acknowledged for proposing and implementing the successful sailing Program in May and the Wednesday evening harbor tours during the summer;
- A major challenge for 2016 will be finding qualified Launch drivers to continue our excellent launch service.

The meeting concluded with the following presentations.

- Jim Breau was recognized for his 50 years of continuous MYC membership with the presentation of an MYC lamp. Jim shared several humorous anecdotes of how he joined Marblehead Yacht Club, the facilities and the \$65 dues.
- Tom Despres was presented with an MYC chair in appreciation of his service as Commodore this year.

The meeting was adjourned and followed by a social hour.

### MYC Gratuity Fund Thank You

Thanks to all who contributed generously to the MYC Gratuity Fund. This year's average contribution was the largest ever and a tangible statement of how much we all value the service provided by our waterfront staff.
