Marblehead Yacht Club has purchased a new upgraded Automatic Electronic Defibrillator (AED) which will be put into service in the Cliff Room very shortly. The Marblehead Fire Chief and his Emergency Services Committee is providing the installation and will offer a free 2 hour course to interested club members and their families covering Basic CPR and AED response. This is a prefect opportunity for all of us to review emergency medical response procedures which may save the life of a loved one, friend or fellow club member.

As a benefit of MYC membership, particularly for non-boating members, the Club is offering an opportunity for you to get on the wate for a tour of the harbor.

From now through August 12th we're offering members free Wednesday evening harbor tours on our club launches. This is a new program. We haven't worked out all the kinks yet, but this is how we think it will work.

On Wednesday evenings we usually have three launches in operation. After all the racers get out, we have about a 30 to 45 minute slot open on one of the launches before that driver's shift ends. We plan to use that time to take up to 15 people on a leisurely harbor tour. Bring your favorite beverage and a snack and enjoy a slow ride through one of the East Coast's great yachting harbors.

We're able to offer this membership benefit through the generosity of Club Manager Bill Kilham. There is no expense to the Club.

Here are the rules (they may change as we get experience with this new program):

- The rides are offered at no cost no tipping. Remember the drivers with the annual gratuity fund.
- Each member may bring one guest (more if spaces are open at sailing time).
- No advance reservations. First come first served. Mid afternoon Wednesday you may leave your name at the launch driver's shack.
- No glass containers on the launch.
- Leave the launch as clean as you found it.
